Dear Staff, Parents, Students and Community Members,

At the June Board of Education meeting, I had the honor of being appointed as Superintendent of the Nutley Public Schools. I officially began this role on July 1st, after having held the position of Assistant Superintendent for two years.

I began my career in education in Nutley, upon graduating from Rutgers University, in 1999. I have been a part of the Nutley community for the past 23 years as teacher, coach, Science Coordinator, and Director of Curriculum, prior to my recent and current roles. I, like you, know what a unique and special place Nutley is.

As I take on this new leadership role and begin the school year, I want to acknowledge our tremendous team who has worked hard all summer to prepare for our students. Our principals, coordinators, Central Office staff, secretaries, custodial, maintenance and grounds staff, and our teachers and support staff members are second to none. Collectively, we all care about our students and their future successes.

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COVID Restrictions

We are looking forward to a return of traditional school practices, with masking continuing to be optional and a return to pre-pandemic distancing guidelines. As we await the NJDOH guidance for the upcoming school year, we are hopeful that the new guidance will help to support the needs of all students. As soon as we receive new guidance from the state, we will follow up with more details.

Curriculum Updates

Over the summer, the ELA curriculum was revised based on the findings of last year's program review. We will also implement PE and Health curriculum to meet the 2020 NJ Department of Education Health and PE standards. Also, the district has provided information specifically intended to build transparency, as well as help parents who wish to opt out their students regarding the 2020 Health Standards. Safety and Security

The state has mandated that crisis and threat assessment teams be in place by next June, 2023. The District has been proactive in safety and security and has this team already in place.

In addition, at Monday night's Board meeting, the district approved additional Safe Schools Resource Officers. We will now employ a full security team, to cover all district schools.

The portal for elementary schools will open on Wednesday, August 31st at 3PM. Students/parents can check the portal then for schedules.
