Dear Nutley Parents, Staff and Community,

I am hopeful this finds you well during this challenging time. So many of us are concerned about our children, our elderly parents, neighbors and friends. We miss our daily routines and face-to-face connections. But, we are each doing what is necessary for now to help mitigate and slow the spread of COVID-19. We are a part of an important moment in global history. I pray that we will never see another period like this during our lifetimes.

We have been told by our local, state and federal health officials, as well as by our government, that this pandemic will get worse, before it gets better. Governor Murphy has ordered that schools will stay closed "until such time as deemed by health officials to be safe for classes to resume."
