SEL Day is an opportunity to spread awareness about the importance and impact of social-emotional learning.

To celebrate SEL Day, throughout the week, our school community will continue to promote social-emotional learning including lessons from the school counselors, advisory, pre-recorded read alouds, morning announcements promoting positive affirmations, and activities.
