Components of the Day

| Arrival | Sets a welcoming tone for the day, to build a caring learning community, and to develop | |

| Breakfast, Handwashing, Sign-In, | social-emotional skills. | |
| Morning Group Meeting | A whole group meeting that sets the tone of the day by providing children with a sense of belonging in a caring learning community; and to develop communication skills as they express their ideas, thoughts and feelings. | |
| Free Choice/Centers | Teachers extend children play and learning in each developmental domain and content area as children explore materials that have been purposefully planned. Teachers practice listening, speaking, and social skills with children, engaging with the individual child's emotional and thinking processes, engage in conversations, expand on language, and introduce new vocabulary or concepts. | |
| Clean-Up | | |
| Small Group | Teachers plan and work with children in small groups every day. Small group experience meet particular instructional goals that include introduction of a new concept or new material teach a specific skill encourage conversation and sharing of ideas extend children's thinking by asking questions and posing new challenges focus observations on individual children and document what children know and can do *WORKSHEETS ARE NOT DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE FOR PRESCHOOLERS | |

| Student Lunch | Builds a caring learning community, models respectable manners, positive attitudes toward food/nutrition, and develops social-emotional skills. |

| Rest Time | Teachers foster the children's love of literacy and promote foundational reading skills by reading aloud to children for both enjoyment and comprehension. |
| Read Aloud | Teachers foster the children's love of literacy and promote foundational reading skills by reading aloud to children for both enjoyment and comprehension. **Including reading aloud, storytelling, story retelling and repeated read aloud. |
| Limited Choice Time/Clean-Up Snack Time | Snack is a choice. Teachers continue to work on instructional goals for students in small groups for students needing additional scaffolding, reteach, or extensions for presented concepts. |
| Large Group Roundup | Reflect on the day's events and provides closure. |

Other Parts of the Day

| Outdoor Time | Children will be going outside daily, weather permitting. Please make sure children are dressed appropriately. Students MUST wear closed toe shoes and sneakers are preferred. As the weather is variable, please be sure to provide a jacket, hat etc. for your student. |

| Meal Time | Families can access My School Bucks to load funds for breakfast and/or lunch. Preschool students also have the ability to pre-order via the Pomptonian app. This app is separate from My School Bucks. My School Bucks can be found on the Nutley Board of Education Website under the Parents tab/Food Services. Families are also welcome to bring in a NUT FREE breakfast/lunch and snack for their student(s). |
| Rest Time | We have purchased cots for students in the program. Please send in a cot sheet. If your child has a preferred small blanket and/or small stuffed animal, they are welcome to bring them to school, in a bag. We will send home all personal items weekly on Fridays for laundering. If sheets need to be washed more frequently we will send them home for cleaning. (Please no nap mats, they do not fit in the cubby) |

The Creative Curriculum consists of studies throughout the year. Celebrations are the finale to each study unit. Whenever a study ends in the classroom, teachers and children reflect and celebrate the wonderful learning that occurred throughout their investigations of a topic. We take this opportunity to invite a special adult in the student's life into the classroom to interact with students while they share what they have learned. Adult participation offers meaningful dialogue to ask children questions, recall what they've learned, share about their work displayed around the room, and much more.



ESi-3 Screening Inventory

Early Screening Inventory-Revised (ESI-3) is a brief assessment procedure designed to identify children who might be at risk for possible learning difficulties or delay. This screening looks at children by quickly sampling their skills across areas of language, reasoning, gross motor, fine motor, and social development.

All new students should be screened within one month of program entry. Parents will be notified prior to screening and a letter needs to go home following screening indicating results:

Refer- Student will be referred to Preschool I&RS (PIRT) Rescreen- 6-8 weeks later child will be rescreened OK- Nothing else needs to be done



P.I.R.T.

The Preschool Intervention and Referral Team (PIRT) is a school-based, collaborative problem-solving team to collaborate with teachers on intervention strategies for children in the general education setting who evidence learning, behavioral, social-emotional, or health difficulties. Students are identified by teachers through the screening process or the observation of the classroom teacher and Preschool Instructional Coach. Parents can also refer their students to the Preschool Intervention and Referral Services Team.

Preschool Intervention Referral Team may consists of the following:

- Early Childhood Supervisor
- Preschool Intervention Referral Specialist
- Social Work
- Community Parent Involvement Specialist
- Preschool Instructional Coach
- Child Study Team Member



Report Cards & Progress Reporting

Students receive report cards 3 times a year as per the elementary school schedule on the academic calendar (December 12, 2025, March 13, 2025 June 18, 2025). Report Cards are sent via the TS App.

Parent teacher conferences will be held in November and can be held upon request.

Students with IEPs will also receive progress reports via the parent portal on goals and objectives according to the same timeline as report cards.

Parent Portal: New families will receive an email with username and password via email towards the end of the summer. Teacher assignments will also be available via the portal.

Emergency contact information will be listed here for student pick up. If parents want to edit their emergency contacts they will do so via the portal.

There are also district questions that must be answered (i.e., student media release, etc) and acknowledgement of the parent handbook.

Early Childhood Advisory Council E.C.A.C.

Early childhood advisory council or "ECAC" means an advisory group of community stakeholders interested in the education and welfare of children in preschool through grade three that is convened by the school district (N.J.A.C.6A:13A-1.2).

The purpose of ECAC is to review preschool program implementation of high-quality programs, serve as advisory support for the local school district's preschool program, and support transition as children move from preschool through grade three.
